Kurt Browning came to Parksville to give the skaters and coaches of the Island an experience not soon to be forgotten. This past weekend, September 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>, skaters from almost every club on Vancouver Island, a total of 102 skaters all together, came to Parksville in order to meet and learn from 4-time World Champion, Kurt Browning. Deena Beacom presented her Theatre On Ice class (Ravi Walia had her present this at his club seminar in Edmonton this year), incorporating acting, edge and turn technique and dance lines to carefully chosen music. Tyler Bidnyk taught his wonderfully original and innovative 'Jump Tech' classes, both on and off ice. Shannon Light had skaters heating up in her off ice fitness class. Judy Burwash presented her popular 'Skater Math' class to the skaters one day and taught the very important Program Componants and Skating Skills classes the next day. Rounding out the staff, local dance teacher, Sarah DeVito, taught an off ice dance movement class. Sarah is held in high regards on the Island and was a great addition to the seminar this year.

I'd like to thank Judy Burwash a million times for the work she did. Judy handled arena bookings (three times!), all the registration and subsequent email interactions, the budget, and countless other duties that were integral to this seminar. Judy has a selfless drive to give the best possible experiences to the skaters of Vancouver Island and this seminar is a shining demonstration of that.
